How we promote British values



Democracy

- We encourage children to have an opinion and listen to others' points of view.
- We encourage children to take turns, share, work together and problem solve as a group.
- We encourage children to ask questions and value the questions they ask.
- We support children to understand that everyone has a voice and is listened to.
- We support children's ideas and requests regarding changes to the environment.
- We treat all the children equally.
- We encourage children to make choices about how they would like to use resources.
- We encourage the children to develop enquiring minds allowing them to extend activities.

Rule of Law

- We support children with understanding their own behaviours and emotions and those of others.
- We support children in distinguishing between right and wrong.
- We involve the children in devising our golden rules.
- We support children to manage and resolve their own disagreements.
- We support children in understanding and implementing the rules of our forest school sessions

Individual Liberty

- We allow children to solve problems, make choices and take risks in a safe, well-managed environment.
- We celebrate children's achievements with WOW moments.
- We are sympathetic to children's feelings and provide reassurance by acknowledging and talking about their emotions.
- · We celebrate everyone's birthdays.
- We do not force a child to join in with activities if they do not wish to.
- We support children to become independent in their self-care skills.

Mutual Respect and Tolerance

- We encourage children to learn about similarities and differences between themselves and others.
- We support children's understanding that they are part of a wider world through our trips and experiences within the community.
- We create an ethos of inclusivity and tolerance where all views, races, faiths and cultures are valued.
- We support children to make relationships, manage their own feelings and behaviour.
- · We support children with turn-taking.
- We celebrate children's achievements.
- We challenge negative perceptions and stereotyping through role modelling and within play experiences.
